Play Ball Baseball Summer Camp Procedures for 2020

Play Ball Baseball Camp Safety Protocols and Procedures includes, but is not limited to the information in the grid below. Play Ball Baseball Camps will follow recommendations from Local governments, the PA Dept of Health 2020 Summer Camp and Recreation Guidelines, CDC Guidance for Youth and Summer Camps, as well as other agencies. Information will be updated as guidelines by the agencies listed above are updated. This document will be sent out with the health screening form, waiver, and updated information prior to the start of camp. ACTION	PROTOCOL
PRE-SCREENING & COVID-19 WAIVER	Parents will Initial and sign the Health Screening form and sign a daily waiver. Bring this completed required form the opening day of camp. Parents will complete the online screening form daily prior to drop off.
DROP-OFF & SPECTATORS	Drop-off begins at 8:15AM. Camp begins at 9AM. Drop off at your camps assigned drop off area. Parents should remain in their vehicle. Camper temperature and arrival screen form is recorded. Temperature of 100.4 or higher the camper is sent home. Campers are asked to wear a mask to camp and can take it off once they are checked in. Parents/spectators will remain in vehicles or socially distanced in parking lots.
SOCIAL DISTANCING & GROUPING	Campers will be instructed to practice social distancing and remain with their group/ team at all times. Teams will be no more than 8 campers per 1 coach. There will be no more than 25 campers/coaches total per active use zone (field). Each separate group will be self-contained as much as possible at their designated active use zone (field). Hand shakes, high-fives, or anything of the sort are discouraged.
COACHES/STAFF	Coaches and Staff will wear masks throughout the day. All drills/stations will be instructed through non-contact means. An Athletic Trainer will be on site and will follow CDC guidelines during treatments.
SANITIZING STATIONS	Hand sanitizer will be available and required for campers and coaches after each drill or station. Campers are encouraged to bring their own personal hand sanitizer.
EQUIPMENT	Campers will keep individual bags at a safe distance away from other campers. Campers will be asked to NOT share any personal equipment. Any shared equipment such as baseballs or tees will be cleaned periodically throughout the day.
LUNCH/DRINKS	Campers will NOT share lunch items, snacks, or drinks. Shared drink coolers will NOT be offered. Campers are expected to bring enough water for the day. Bottled water will be available as needed, but campers must be served water. Campers will not have sunflower seeds and are asked not to chew up or spit during camp.
BATHROOMS	Bathrooms available at facilities. Campers will have staggered bathroom times and be distanced appropriately. Knobs, handles, etc will be disinfected regularly.
PICK-UP	Parents must remain in their vehicle or socially distant in the parking. Coaches will accompany their group to the assigned pick up area. Campers will only be allowed to leave with another family if prior written consent is received by camp directors.
RESPONSE TO SYMPTOMS/POSITIVE CASE	Campers/Coaches displaying symptoms will be re-screened. If a camper has a temperature above 100.4 his parents will be contacted and asked to pick up their son from camp. The campers group will be closely monitored. If there is a positive case at camp, ALL parents will be contacted and campers will be closely monitored. If a camper can no-longer participate in camp or if a camper is not-comfortable continuing camp, prorated refunds will be provided.
